Education




Each year, we teach over 10,000 children from over 150 schools about money management through our free DebtAware financial capability programme.

Financial education and the ability to manage money is one of the most important life skills we can teach our children.

Research shows that many of the habits that relate to financial capability are formed by the age of seven. Yet, financial capability is still not a compulsory part of the primary national curriculum.

DebtAware seeks to embed the knowledge, understanding, attitudes and behaviours that will enable children to manage their finances with confidence in the years to come.

Debt advice




According to Money Advice Service, over 8m people in the UK are over-indebted.

We advise over 10,000 people each year that call our free telephone counselling helpline. Many people call us because they have experienced an unexpected life event, such as the loss of a job or illness that leaves them unable to afford their debt repayments.

Last year we helped callers deal with over £30m of unsecured debt. The average unsecured caller debt was £17,501. Credit cards accounted for the highest proportion of debt (38%).

The average debt repayment period fell from over 11 years to 3.3 years following our intervention.
